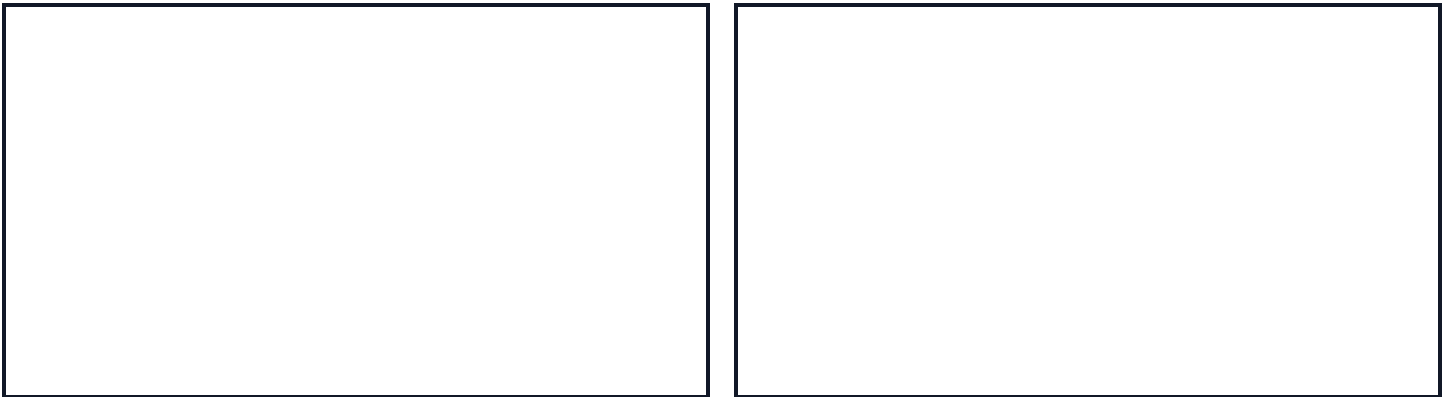

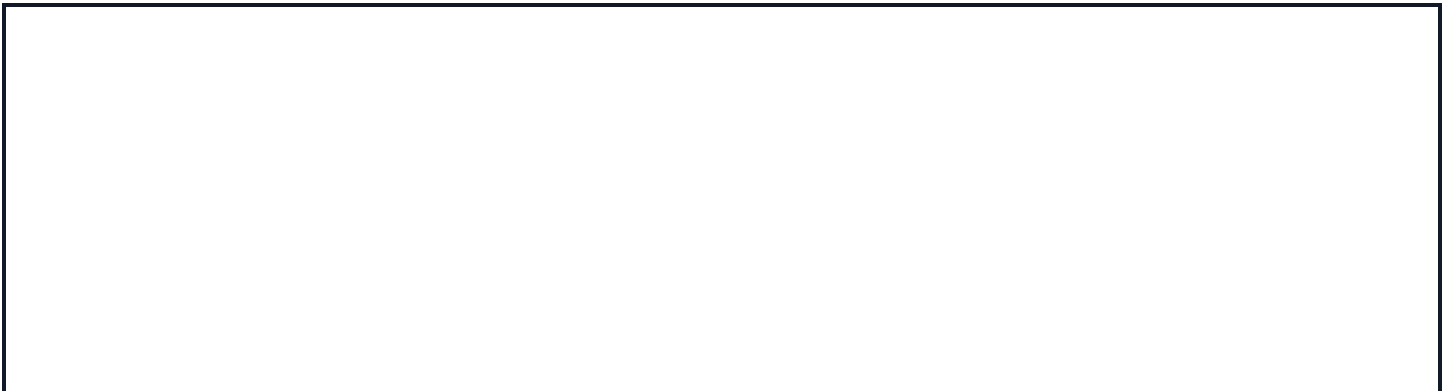
TIER 1 – ESTABLISH

WHY THESE PANELS ARE WIDER

A newspaper strip is a fixed column read in isolation, so its panels are near-square and self-contained. A strip inside a comic book is a **tier** — one horizontal band of a full page, read as part of the page above and below it. Tiers are wider than they are tall, which gives you room for establishing shots and two-character conversations without cramping the lettering.

PACING CHEAT SHEET

Blank tiers, plus what each shape does to the reader's eye.

- **Four narrow panels** — fast. Rapid dialogue, a countdown, a montage.
- **Three even panels** — neutral. The default conversational tier.
- **One wide panel** — slow. An establishing shot, or a silent beat before a turn.
- **Two panels, uneven** — tension. The larger one is the one that matters.
